Phase Two Requirements Relating to COVID-19 During a Public Health Emergency

<p>DC HEALTH GOVERNMENT OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Must complete ReOpen DC Webinar (register at food.safety@dc.gov.)• Outdoor seating and indoor dining limited to six (6) per table.• May serve up to 50% of maximum capacity.• Bar seating prohibited if any bartender is working at that bar.• Parties at the bar must be separated by at least six (6) feet.• Tables must be at least six (6) feet apart, measured from the nearest point of the seats when occupied.• Buffets permitted only if food is served by the establishment.• Live entertainment permitted if all patrons are seated and entertainers are at least six (6) feet from each other and at least ten (10) feet from the nearest patron.	 <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Advance registration with the District is not required for an establishment to start offering indoor dining. Reopening is optional.• Establishments must continue to register with the District to add new or expanded seating for outdoor dining on public or private space.• Indoor dining occupancy must be limited to 50 percent of the lowest occupancy load or seating capacity on the CofO (employees not included).• Communal tables are permitted if parties are seated at least six (6) feet apart and divisions are marked.• Licensed movie theaters are permitted to open but parties must be seated six (6) feet apart.
 <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Acknowledge commitment to and understanding of the requirements to operate safely during DC Phase Two, and that failure to comply may result in enforcement activities.• Identify point of contact for compliance and enforcement matters.	 <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Must complete Phase One registration.• Adhere to the guidelines for table and chair placement on sidewalks.• If providing new or expanded seating on the sidewalk complete a temporary sidewalk table service permit.• Maintain at least four (4) feet between seating and the clear pedestrian path, which should be at least six (6) feet wide.
